

Lawrence Jacklin (1909 – 1938)



Lawrence Jacklin (1909 – 1938) was born in New Whittington, Derbyshire in the fourth quarter of 1909. His parents were Charles Jacklin (1874 – 1929) and Florence Bunn (1913 - 1992). He was baptised at New Whittington Parish Church on the 9th November 1909. His father was a native of Kirkby Green in Lincolnshire and his mother was a native of Sutton Coldfield in Warwickshire. Lawrence was their second child following their marriage on the 8th December 1906 in Sutton Coldfield. On the 1911 Census, Lawrence aged 2 was living with his parents and older sister at 13 Handley Road, New Whittingham. His father was employed as a harness and collar maker, basically a saddler by the Staveley Coal and Iron Company.

After leaving school he became a miner

In 1932 at the age of 22, Lawrence married Elizabeth Hallam (1913 – 1992) in the Chesterfield registration district. Lawrence and Elizabeth had two children

At the time of the disaster, Lawrence and his family were living at 2, West Crescent, Duckmanton, as he was employed as a Contractor at Markham Colliery.

In 1942 his wife placed an In Memoriam notice in the Derbyshire Times

JACKLIN – In memory of a dear husband and father, Lawrence Jacklin, died May 10th, 1938

From his Wife, Lawrence and Sydney.

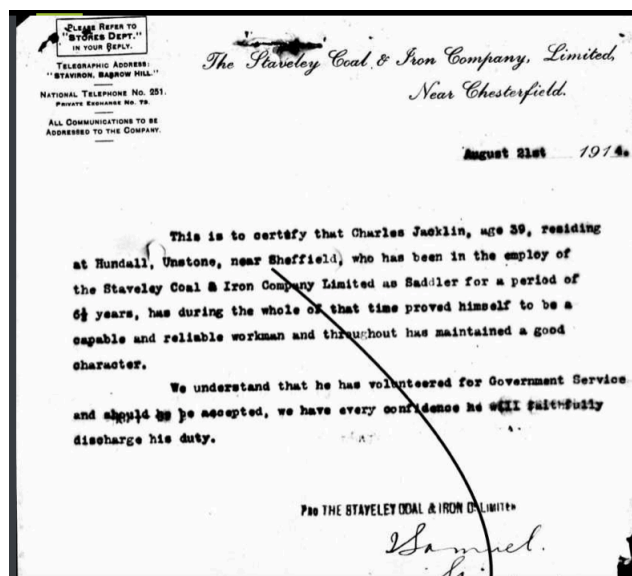
PARENTS

Father: Charles Jacklin (1874 – 1929)

Charles Jacklin (1874 – 1929) was born in Kirkby Green in Lincolnshire. His parents were Joseph Jacklin (1836 – 1908) and Martha Carter (1838 – 1893). On the 1881 Census, Charles, aged six, was living with his parents and five siblings in Kirkby Green. His father was employed as an agricultural labourer. By the time of the 1891 Census, Charles aged 16 had left school and was employed as a saddlers apprentice in Kirkby Green. The 1901 Census shows that Charles was now a fully qualified saddler, and was in the employment of Harriet Parkinson, who was both an employer and saddler. She was a widow and had taken over the business from her husband. This was in the village of Ruskington in Lincolnshire.

In 1906 he married Florence Bunn in Sutton Coalfield, Warwickshire. Their first child, Marguerite Joyce was born the following year. Their second child was Lawrence who was born in New Whittington in 1909. Therefore, between 1907 and 1909, Charles, Florence and Marguerite moved from Sutton Coldfield to Derbyshire

In 1915, Charles, aged 40, signs up for the army. He joins the Army Service Corp on the 8th March 1915. He joined the Corps in Woolwich. He was to be employed as a saddler. At the time of enlistment he was working for the Staveley Coal and Iron Company, Limited. The company sent a reference letter to the Army on the 21st August 1914, so Charles obviously made it known that he wanted to enlist very soon after the outbreak of the war.



On the 7th May 1921 Charles was granted the Victory and Star medals for his services in the war.


Charles died in 1929 at the age of 55.

Mother: Florence Bunn (1882 – 1946)

Florence Bunn (1882 – 1946) was born in Sutton Coldfield in 1882. Her parents were Joseph Bunn (1852- 1925) and Jane Davenport (1849 -). Both of her parents came from the Telford area of Shropshire. Her father was a bricklayer and her brothers also became bricklayers. On the 1881 Census her parents and two older siblings were living on Coleshill Street in Sutton Coldfield, where they remained for the next 30 years. One of her brothers, Joseph (1886 – 1965) emigrated to the United States and was a bricklayer in Cleveland, Ohio. His wife, Emma Statham, had sailed in 1911 to the United States on the liner Lusitania, which was later sunk by a German U-Boat in 1915.

Florence married Charles Jacklin in Sutton Coldfield in 1906. They would have three children, including Lawrence, who was born in 1909. Her husband died in 1929 and her son was killed in the 1938 Markham disaster. In 1939 she was living in Chesterfield. She was living with George Bown a widower. George was a locomotive driver. Please note the record below, has three mistakes. For Jackson, read Jacklin, for 9 Jun 1880, read 9 Jun 1882, and she was widowed not married. The errors are a result of the poor condition of the document. In 1940 Florence married George and she died in the Chesterfield area in 1946.

Wife: Elizabeth Hallam (1913 – 1992)

Elizabeth Hallam (1913 – 1992) was born on the 18th June 1913 in Whittington, Derbyshire. Her parents were Thomas Hallam (1880 – 1953) and Florence Adlington (1878 – 1918). On the 1911 Census, her parents and an older brother were living at 68 Duke Street, Whittington Moor. Her father was employed as a coal miner – hewer. Her father had been born in Whittington and her mother was from Chesterfield. Elizabeth was their third child, the first child Herbert born in 1901 had died in 1902. In September 1932 Elizabeth, aged 19 married Lawrence. They had two children, Lawrence and Sidney. After the disaster which killed her husband in 1938, Elizabeth continued to live at 2 West Crescent, Duckmanton with

her two young children. She was now sharing the house with another widow, Margaret A Frost and possibly her child.

Elizabeth, aged 48, married Trevor Gordon Hurst (1918 – 2002) in 1961 and she died in 1992
